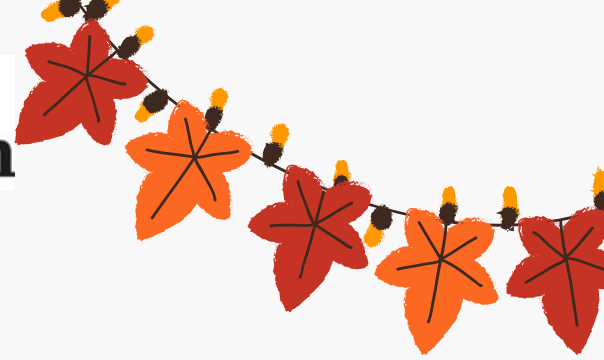

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Use of Equipment

In accordance with 2 CFR 200.313(c), equipment must be used by the non-Federal entity in the program or project for which it was acquired. When no longer needed for the original program or project, the equipment may be used in other activities supported by the Federal awarding agency, in the following order of priority:

1. Activities under a Federal award from the Federal awarding agency which funded the original program or project, then
2. Activities under Federal awards from other Federal awarding agencies.

Disposition of Equipment

In accordance with 2 CFR 200.313(e), when original or replacement equipment acquired under a Federal award is no longer needed for the original program or project, or other activities currently or previously supported by a Federal awarding agency, the non-Federal entity must request disposition instructions from the Federal awarding agency, as required by the terms and conditions of the Federal award.
