## Blindness Registry

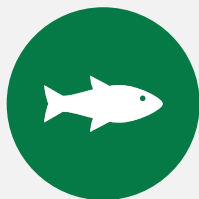


Through SBVI, VR New Hampshire provides an array of supports to help people who are blind or vision impaired earn, learn, and live life to the fullest. One of these is the state's *Blindness Registry*.

### About the Blindness Registry

If you're a New Hampshire resident who is blind, vision impaired, or deaf-blind, consider adding your name to the state blindness registry. Being listed on the registry is voluntary, but the information is used by the state to verify eligibility for certain benefits, among them property tax deductions.

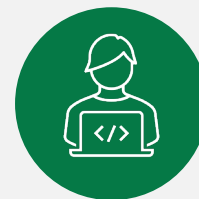
