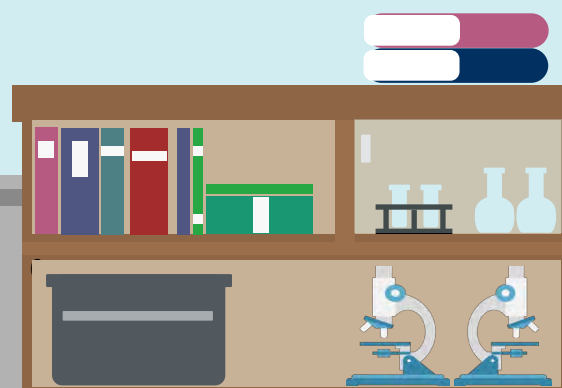
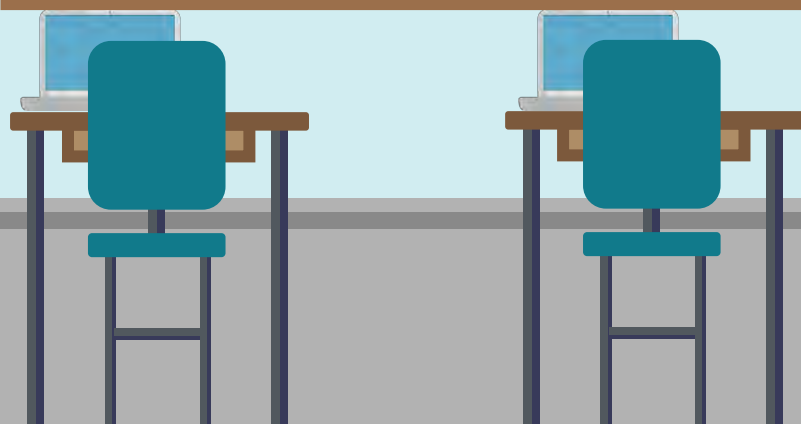




# Classroom Tip Series: Science Rooms

- Have working fire extinguisher in lab/storage area
- Have eye protection available
- Have emergency eyewash and shower equipment readily available
- Test eye wash and shower stations regularly
- Have appropriate chemical spill cleanup kits available
- Keep an updated chemical list accessible
- Label, identify, store, and dispose of biological and hazardous chemicals according to safety standards
- Label all materials, even if it is just water!
- Have containers of acids stored on bottom shelves or in acid storage closets
- Check fume hoods and gas valves are in working order
- Ventilate chemical storage rooms
