The overarching goal of the Statewide EL Advisory Committee is ***to improve the educational outcomes and school experience of the State's English learners.***

New Hampshire's English learners are (1) entitled to certain legal protections and services by virtue of their status as language learners, AND (2) valuable assets within our local school communities capable of rigorous learning and achievement.

Goal 1: Strengthen systems that support educator and program effectiveness

English learners will thrive in educational settings where the educators around them have the information and supports they need to design and implement equitable programs and services.

- Revise policies and procedures to ensure compliance with updates in federal law and clear communication
- Identify and develop State policies, procedures and recommendations focused on advancing the educational outcomes of NH's English learners (ELs)

Goal 2: Strengthen statewide EL educator networks to leverage knowledge and resources

To design and deliver quality instruction for English learners, educators need guidance, examples, time, leadership and opportunities for collaboration that are sustained, embedded and relevant.

- Improve communication within statewide professional EL educator networks
 - Sustain regular statewide EL educator meetings for a variety of stakeholders and for a variety of purposes (i.e., compliance updates, professional learning, technical trainings, stakeholder engagement, etc.).
