

# We Are VR: State Rehabilitation Council

We're on a mission to help students and adults with disabilities prepare for and join our state's workforce—and you can help. Please consider joining the New Hampshire State Rehabilitation Council (SRC)!

### What is the SRC?

The SRC is VR New Hampshire's central advisory group. It helps steer the agency's policies and procedures to ensure we meet the employment needs of New Hampshire residents with disabilities, as well as the businesses that stand to benefit from their skills and talent.

SRC members—more than half of whom have disabilities themselves—are appointed by the Governor for a maximum of two full three-year terms.

### Who can serve on the SRC?

The Governor may appoint any of the following to the SRC:

- Any individual with a disability or their representative
- Other rehabilitation service providers
- Representatives from programs with which the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation has cooperative agreements and groups from which it would like to receive advice
- Business representatives

## Why do we have an SRC?



VR New Hampshire is one of nearly 80 partners in the state-federal vocational rehabilitation program mandated by the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) of 2014. Each is required to have an SRC in

order to receive federal funding. But, just as importantly, the SRC plays a critical role in helping us ensure we meet the needs of individuals with disabilities and businesses in our state.
